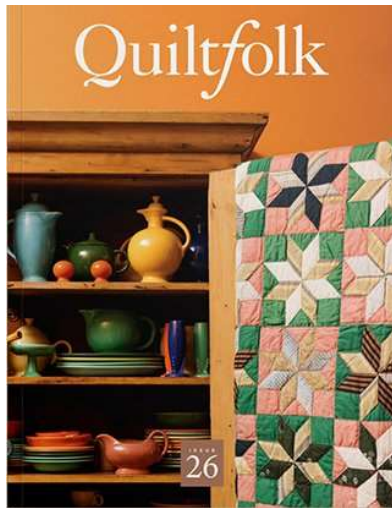

2023 Quilt Show and Museum Sales

1. Quilt Show Theme -- This year's quilt show will be held October 31 - November 17. This year's theme is using circles so think about circles in your pattern, fabric, etc. More details will follow in the coming months.
2. Help Wanted -- We have some wonderful opportunities on this year's committee. We need someone to type up the brochure from the registration forms. If you're familiar with Microsoft Word you can do this. We already have a template so it's just inputting the new information. Also, we need someone to type up the information cards. This is straight forward typing with the information from the registration forms. Both items are then just emailed to Howell Printing and they do the rest. Linda Williamson has offered to help with this but I'd like another person to help -- one doing the brochure and one doing the cards. Many hands make light work!
3. Continue working on those items for the museum store. I received more guidance from the museum as to what they'd like to receive:

The following items may be good for the next round: aprons, microwave bowls, plastic bag holders/dispensers, trivets/hot pads, and potholders, all in summery patterns. We have found that utilitarian items sell the best, but as always are open to suggestions. Beach bags and sunglass holders may be a good addition to the mix. I believe that the jewelry pouches sold well. The carrots and baskets sold out very fast, so that is something they'd like to repurchase next spring. And, of course, we already have requests for the angels at Christmas.

Keeping the above in mind, I'll be collecting items at the June meeting and I'll deliver what I have and talk to them about the future items. Thanks for all your help in trying to get our quilt show in the black!
