As a new quilter and new CPQ member last year, I was excited to learn as much as I could. When Paula Brown announced the Pieceable Retreat organized by the Quilters of South Carolina (QSC), I visited their website to find out more. As I read the class descriptions and viewed the photos of the amazing course opportunities, I fell in love with the red and white Fans in Formation quilt by Cindy Page from Quilter's Gallery and decided to take a chance and go. Thanks to Paula's advice, I included good lighting and extension cords on my list of things to bring. Jean Ridley added that shelf liner would help keep my foot pedal from sliding around. My personal advice is to wear comfortable shoes, because there was a lot of walking!

Classes were held during the morning and afternoon, and there were fun-filled and informative programs with door prizes every evening. I won a charm pack and batting!

- Thursday: Welcome, President's Challenge, District Representatives Meet and Greet. This was a lovely way to meet and chat with other quilters. I learned that 17 CPQ attended the retreat.
- Friday: Speaker Paige Alexander and Show and Tell. Paige wowed the audience with her Modern Plus Sign quilts.
- Saturday: Classroom Parade and President Notes. I did not know about the Classroom Parade, so I missed the chance to join my classmates on stage with my unfinished work.

There were also 5 vendors that offered many lovely fabrics and tools. Classes and all meals (Thursday dinner through Sunday lunch) were included in the 2018 registration fee.

If you've never attended a quilting retreat, I urge you to go. Even though I selected a class that was too advanced for me, I still learned a lot—and I had a lot of fun. This year's Pieceable Retreat is open to members of QSC and will be held Thursday, October 24th – Sunday, October 27th at the DoubleTree Hotel by Hilton in Myrtle Beach, SC. Gone Shopping

In November, 2018, Lexington, SC saw the opening of a new quilt shop called **Jessamine**, a true quilt shop that carries high quality cotton fabrics, batiks and sewing/quilting thread. Jessamine also has a nice collection of yarn for those interesting in knitting or crocheting. The store is 50 miles from Aiken or about one hour by car traveling East on I-20 and then a series of 2 lane roads.

The proprietor is Jann Boyd who is ably assisted by instructors Nancy McWilliams, Chris Hammond, and Betty Tenon. Jan is originally from New York and spent many years in western Canada prior to relocating to Lexington. Assisting Jann in the business is her daughter who manages the store's website and serves as the buyer for the yarn offerings.

The store is open Wednesday through Friday from 10 - 6 and Saturday from 10 - 3. A listing of classes, largely project focused, can be found on their website. Quilts of Valor sew-ins are held the 2nd and 4th Thursdays of the month, and there is an open sew-in on Wednesdays and a handwork beehive on Fridays. Jann is also willing to design customized instruction for groups of 3 or more with classroom availability on Thursdays and Saturdays.

The Joy is in the Journey

One of the unexpected joys of serving as CPQ president is having the opportunity to visit offline with members and ask questions about what inspires them in their quilting journey. We are all used to seeing routine quilting magazines, such as McCall's, American Patchwork and Quilting, and Fons and Porters Love of Quilting at the local news stand. Many of you also may subscribe to AQ from the American Quilt Society.

Are you looking for something new or different? Two publications that have drawn my attention were recommended by guild members Lucy Bureau and Sherry Hodge. Lucy's pick is *Where Women Create* which comes out four times a year and is available at Books-A-Million in the Aiken Mall. Each issue is visually inspiring and takes you inside the studios of creative women.

Sherry introduced me to *Quiltfolk* when she sent me an article by the founder about "The Quilt you Didn't Make". This book-like publication also comes out four times a year and is available by subscription at an annual price of \$75/year. This magazine celebrates the people and the stories behind the stitches so reads like a collection of short stories rather than a monthly collection of patterns and projects. Each issue takes a journey through an individual state. Recent editions included Issue #9 - Utah and Issue #10 - Vermont.
