Biography

Joyce is a graduate of Moore College of Art & Design in Philadelphia, PA with a Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in illustration and design. She has been sewing and quilting for over 35 years, and has been teaching art and quilting classes for the past 14 years throughout the southeast. She enjoys creating her own quilt designs, and is inspired by nature, color and of course, fabric. She works in all quilt mediums, including machine and hand piecing, applique', painting on fabric, hand and machine quilting, and much more. She also has a special love for surface embellishment and hand embroidery.



Joyce has acquired many blue ribbon awards including “Best in Show” in the York County Quilt Show in 2008, Best Overall Color Award in 2012, and Best Overall Handwork Award at the Asheville Quilt Show in 2015. Her pieces have been proudly exhibited in gallery showings, including a private show at the Rock Hill Performance Center in October 2014, and an appliqué exhibit in May & June 2015. She was published as the Featured Fiber Artist in the December 2014 and August 2015 issues of York County Magazine and featured in Quilt Scene Magazine in October 2015 at the Houston International Quilt Festival. For the past three years ribbons were awarded for quilts in the York County Quilt Show, The Asheville Quilt Show, and several other southeastern quilt shows. She continues to show her quilts throughout North and South Carolina.
