


Carolina Pine Quilters 39th Annual Quilt Show Aiken County Historical Museum November 5-23, 2019

We will be receiving your quilt applications, pictures and payments at the Aiken County Historical Museum on September 22, from 2-5pm, and September 23 from 11am-2pm. There is a \$10 entry fee for one or two quilts, and \$5 for each third, fourth and fifth quilt. Also, entries may be mailed to Carolina Pine Quilters, c/o Pat Kaufman, 1168 Richardsons Lake Road, Aiken, SC 29803. All mailed entries must be **received** by September 21. A picture of your quilt is requested to help in planning the layout of the quilt show. It may be printed on plain paper, and we ask that you include your name and the name of your quilt on the back of your picture.

Please check the sign-up sheets at the September guild meeting for times and ways you can help put on our show. Quilt take-in will take place on October 27 from 2-5pm and October 28 from 11am-2pm at the museum. Quilts will be judged on Wednesday, October 30, beginning at 9am. Better Homes and Gardens Complete Guide to Quilting, 2nd edition

Adela Dziekanowski, CPQ guild membership chair and webmaster, recommends the Better Homes and Gardens Complete Guide to Quilting as a useful reference for beginning quilters. This hardcover book is spiral bound so that it can be easily folded to keep pages flat while you are sewing and referencing at the same time. The book includes a large quantity of color photos, diagrams and charts to augment the text which is particularly helpful to new quilters.
