Quilt Show: Entry forms are online and printed copies are available at the meeting. All entries must be received no later than September 22. Sign-up sheets are available for quilt take in and scribing. Continue to make items for the museum store for fall and Christmas. Pieceable Retreat has 153 registered students which is 30 more than last year. Registration ends August 31.
